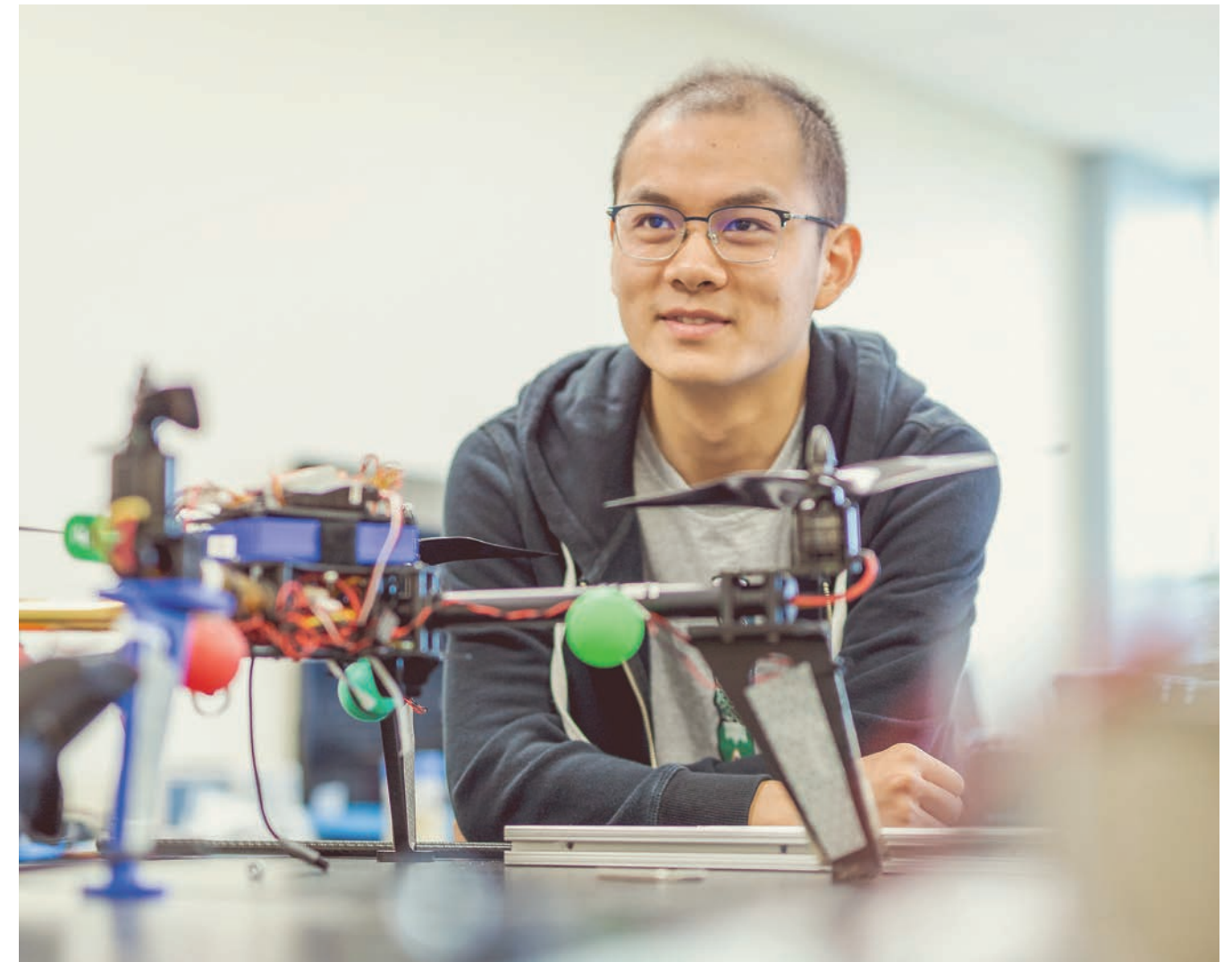

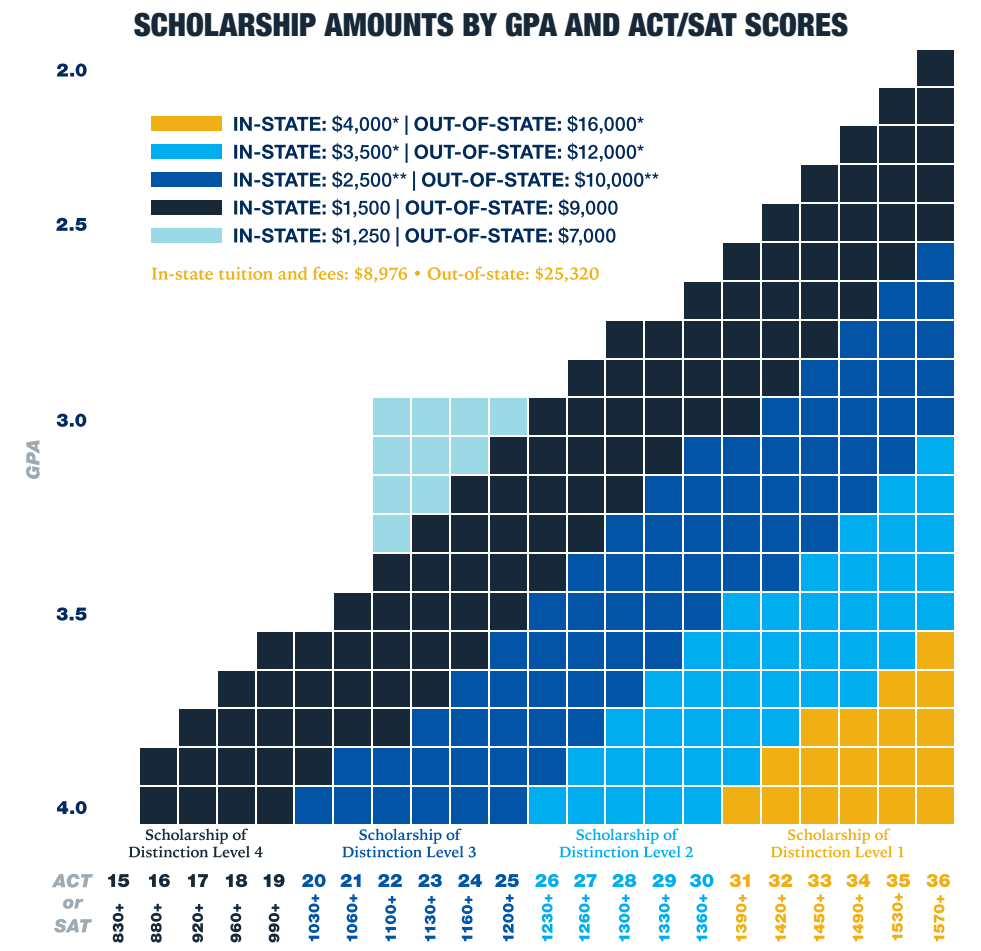


BERNADINE KWAN WAN LING

MINIMUM ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS
